Making the Invisible Visible Exhibit

Palisades Center's BRIDGES, an Independent Living Center dedicated to advocacy and leadership on behalf of people with disabilities, was awarded a grant from Arts Westchester, an advocate for accessibility and diversity of the arts in Westchester and the surrounding counties, for a Women Veterans Photography Project, entitled Making the Invisible Visible. The exhibit will showcase 18 Women Veterans in 24"x36" black and white photographs. It will be located on Level One near Macy's and on display for six months.

A ribbon cutting ceremony will take place on Friday, November 6 at 10:00am in front of the exhibit.

BRIDGES' Executive Director, Carlos Martinez, states "For too long, women who served felt invisible. Women have stated, 'I didn't feel like a Veteran' or 'I never thought the VA clinics and centers were for me.' This project highlights the unwavering commitment of women Veterans who have sacrificed, put their lives on the line for their country, and offers their perspective on what it meant to serve."

Sharon Bailey, BRIDGES' PFC Joseph P Dwyer Veteran Peer Support Administrator and Making the Invisible Visible Veteran stated, "The purpose of the Making the Invisible Visible exhibit is to empower women Veterans and provide them with a transformational experience. Throughout the project, we quickly began to realize that women Veterans need moments in time to share their experiences. In the end, the project transformed me."

Rockland Buffalo Soldiers Veterans Day Recognition

On Wednesday, November 11 at 11:00am, the Rockland Buffalo Soldiers will hold an honorable Veteran service within Mount Moor Historical Cemetery to acknowledge the Veterans interred at the Cemetery. The Cemetery is accessible by the F-Lot at Palisades Center near Dick's Sporting Goods.

The Buffalo Soldiers is a label first given to members of the African American cavalry regiments of the United States Army who served in the western United States from 1867 to 1896, noted for their courage and discipline. Today, there are numerous chapters around the United States, including the Rockland Buffalo Soldiers based out of Spring Valley, New York. The Mount Moor Cemetery is listed on the National Park Service's Register of Historic Places and preserved by the Historical Society of Rockland County.
